As you swap your hiking boots for polished shoes on the cobblestones of Odense's historic city center, allow the memories of your verdant exploration to infuse the urban landscape with a newfound appreciation of the interconnected worlds of nature, fairy tale, and humanity, just as Hans Christian Andersen did centuries ago.
